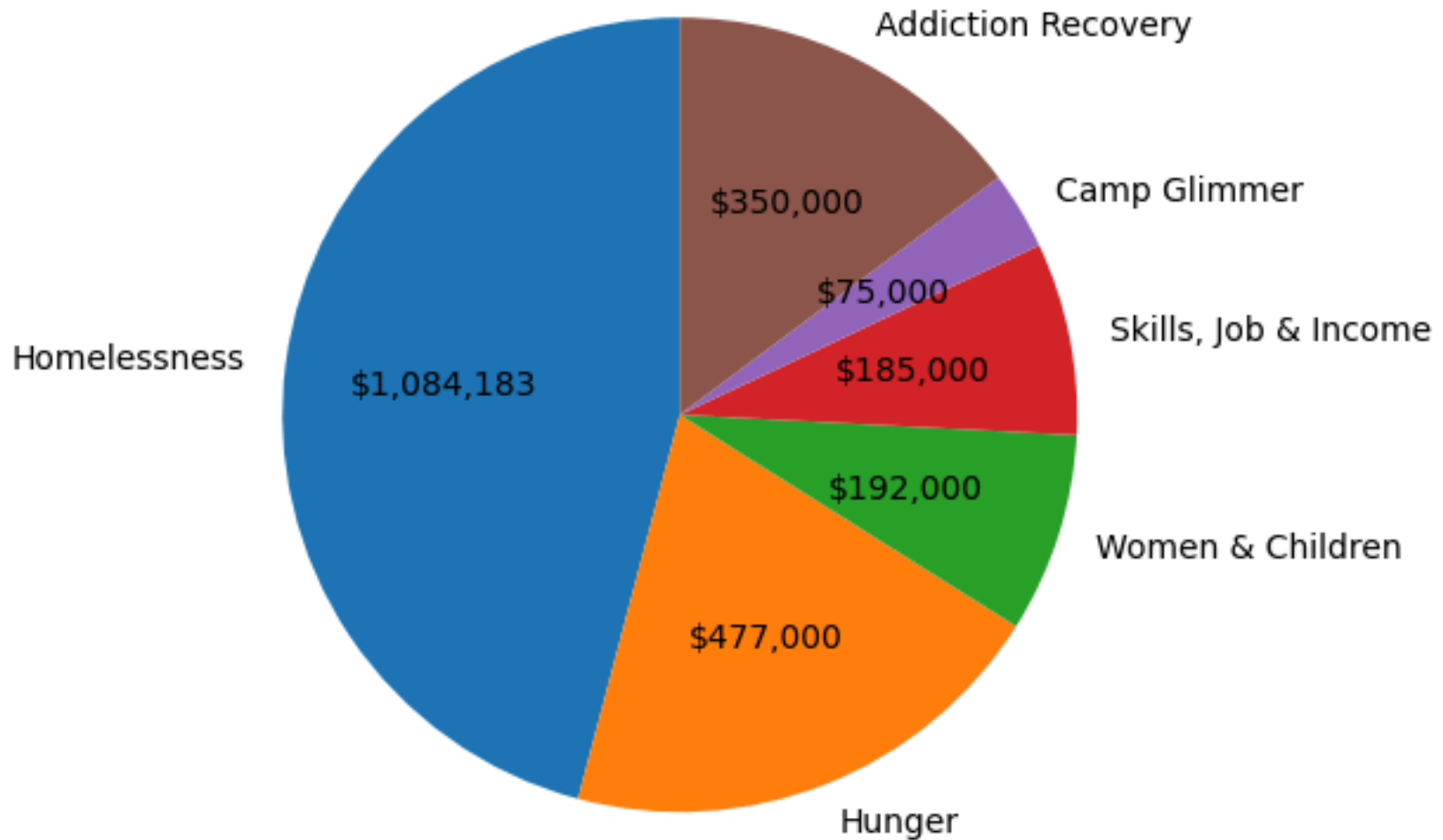




# 2025 GRANTS BY PROGRAMS

# HIGHLIGHTS OF 2025

- In Austin and Travis County, 28,000 homeless people were served by the local Homeless Response System - which includes many homeless agencies and programs funded by Glimmer Austin
- The Wayfinder Program from Sunrise was the most innovative and successful approach to reducing homelessness in 2025 - it alone housed over 1000 families. We were one of its lead funders.
- We continue to partner with and fund other major Homeless Agencies, Programs and sources of Housing, including Community First Village, Lifeworks, and TOOF.
- Keep Austin Fed rescued 93,000 lbs of food (78,000 meals) redirecting it to local nonprofits and shelters. We funded the expansion of its volunteer capacity, alongside grants to other food recovery agencies
- We funded the launch of Recovery Outside, helping individuals in their addiction recovery, build community, connection, and purpose through outdoor activities like sports, climbing, and camps.
- SAFE Austin and other Shelters provided safe housing and shelter to abused women and children, helping individuals and families escape violence and move toward stability.
- American YouthWorks served over 1,000 young people, providing education and workforce training that leads to long-term career success.

# STRATEGIC PARTNERS: HOMELESSNESS

**Community First! Village** has expanded to four large communities and exemplifies compassionate, community-centered housing, setting a national standard for care and inclusion. We are honored to stand alongside Alan Graham and his team since the start.

**Sunrise Homeless Navigation Center** housed 1,800 people and emerged as one of the most effective and cost-efficient homeless agencies - plus provided essential services including food, safekeeping medical supplies, medical care, and sustained outreach

**Lifeworks** addresses Youth Homelessness through housing, mental health, education, and workforce services and job support, LifeWorks offers a team that listens, adapts, and walks alongside each young person as they pursue goals that matter to them.

**The Other Ones Foundation** provides transitional on site housing in mini homes, rehousing through “Going Home”, plus work programs, employment and essential services.
