HIGHLIGHTS OF 2024


Thanks to our incredible partners, Glimmer | Austin is proud of the impact we have made together in Austin and Travis County in 2024. This year, we have:

- Helped house homeless families, children, youth, and individuals providing safe and stable short-term and permanent housing.
- Collected surplus food from supermarkets and distributed it to those in need - delivering food to hungry families, children, and individuals.
- Ensured access to safe spaces and shelters for abused mothers and their children.
- Supported individuals on their journey from addiction to recovery.
- Over 600 children enjoyed a fun-filled summer camp experience at Camp Glimmer free of charge.

In addition to our Grants, other Foundations co-invested alongside Glimmer | Austin to expand our reach and impact.

STRATEGIC PARTNERS: HOMELESSNESS



Gllimmer | Austin funded of **the Wayfinder program**, a Diversion Program, that moves homeless people off the streets into existing affordable low cost apartments. To date, this has provided housing to over 1000 people. Recognizing its effectiveness and cost-efficiency, the City of Austin has since joined Glimmer in funding this program.



The Other Ones Foundation (TOOF) provides employment, shelter, and supportive services to individuals experiencing homelessness. TOOF **served 700** individuals, helping 296 transition into stable housing and housing and supporting 100 homeless people on site in mini homes helping people rebuild their lives.



Community First! Village, provides affordable, permanent housing and a supportive community for individuals transitioning out of chronic homelessness. CFV houses and supports over **350 formerly homeless** individuals. With ongoing expansions, in Phase II and III, CFV plans to house 1,400 more residents.



LIFEWORKS Over the past four years, the number of young people experiencing homelessness in Travis County has nearly quadrupled. In response, LifeWorks has expanded its outreach, housing solutions, and mental health support, providing critical services to ensure **youth homelessness** is rare, brief, and non-recurring.
